Some of us have commented that we feel we're in a vacuum and have lost perspective on the passage of time. With so many traditions, holidays, routines, and supplies disrupted, our days might seem to be going down the Rabbit Hole. But on this side of the Looking Glass, it's spring and we're about to hold our **Annual Meeting**, our first indoor in-person meeting in two years.

This yearly event triggers reflection on our neighborhood and the role of the WLPCA. Perhaps in the past we could enjoy our safe, lovely neighborhood without having to do much to keep it that way other than tend our gardens and maintain our homes, but we no longer can afford that luxury. **Crimegrade.org gives our zip code a D+** (for comparison, Detroit is graded C-) and **HPD identified 77027 as having the highest increase in violent crime in the city, up 109%** over 2019, the greatest activity occurring at the **CVS at Westheimer and 610**. These startling statistics aside, most of us feel the elevated threat and take precautions every day, but **we must all be aware, we must all take precautions, and we must all be engaged.**

To strengthen West Lane Place, we need to work together, and one of the best ways to work together is through our civic association. Our residents possess tremendous talent, skill, and experience. Tapping into those assets, we can solve tremendous problems if all of us work together. The more of us who join and volunteer, the greater our impact will be.

I've seen many changes and met my best friends during the thirty years I've lived in West Lane Place. This neighborhood is uniquely situated as a respite in the midst of uber urban turmoil. I believe you agree that we live in a remarkable area; that's why you choose to be here. 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Attempted Armed Break-ins on Mid Lane

In the early morning of **Monday, March 21**, residents in the 2700 block of Mid Lane discovered an intruder had breached the walls of their private garden and was attempting to break the glass to enter their house. When detected, he ran away, leaving behind his jacket and cap. While police were at the scene investigating, the same guy tried to break the glass next door. When apprehended, he claimed to be the boyfriend of the second neighbor, returning to pick up his clothes.

Thankfully our neighbors suffered no physical injury during these attempted invasions, but **police found a gun** in the patio of the second home. They arrested the intruder and charged him with **unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon.**

As this incident proves, we must be vigilant, keep our houses locked, and our alarms turned on even when we are at home.

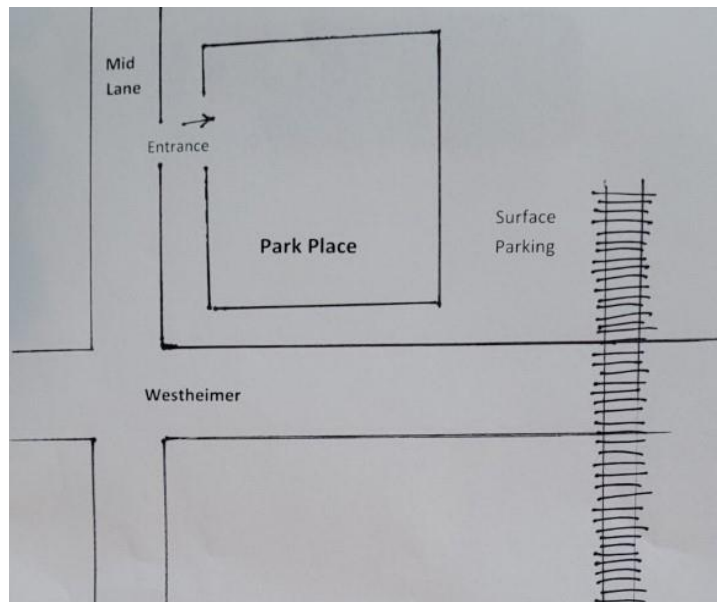

“Tree Waste” is defined as “clean wood waste such as tree limbs, branches, and stumps (lumber, furniture, and treated wood will NOT be accepted.)”

“Junk Waste” is defined as “items such as furniture, appliances, and other bulky material.”

Obnoxious **plastic shopping bags** can go to a bin at **Central Market** to be recycled rather than blown into the sea to entangle unfortunate sea life.

Someday, when Martian archeologists eventually explore Planet Earth, their digs will uncover huge landfills full of **styrofoam peanuts** because they never go away. Why not extend their usefulness by re-using them? If you can’t re-use them yourself, take clean peanuts to a shipping service, like the **Post N Parcel** at 3733 Westheimer.
