# Important HCAD Election Coming Up! Our chance to improve the Property Tax Appraisal Process! by Gilda Bayegan

In the election held last November, Harris County voters passed **Proposition 4** which, paired with **Senate Bill 2**, authored by Texas Senator Paul Bettencourt, increases the number of seats on the Harris County **Appraisal District's Board of Directors by three new members** that we elect. Until now, there were five members on the board, all appointees of governmental entities that benefit from high property taxes. **This is our first opportunity to put members on the board who represent tax payers.** 

This election is very important for all property owners. Research the candidates carefully.

**Don't wait until Election Day to vote** when weather, unexpected chores, or an emergency could interfere with your plans. **Vote early!** 

Early voting begins Monday, April 22

Last day of Early Voting is Tuesday, April 30

Election Day is Saturday, May 4

As of publication, the listed polling location closest to us is the **Metropolitan MultiService Center** on **West Gray** across from the Marshall's River Oaks shopping center. Check with **HarrisVotes.org/Vote-Centers** for updates as more locations are added to the list.

# Watch Where You Park by Patricia Hunt Holmes

Neighbors recently observed HPD writing tickets and towing cars parked on the dead end of West Alabama, and Pat Holmes is looking into this new development.

Residents of West Lane Place need to be aware that Houston Police Department has started enforcing the "No Parking" signs in our neighborhood. The signs are mostly on the East side of Mid Lane between Westheimer and the north leg of Lana Lane and on West Alabama. On Saturday, March 30, HPD oversaw the towing of two cars parked on West Alabama just east of Mid Lane. We will investigate this further and report what we find out in future newsletters.

# Repairs to Westheimer by Gilda Bayegan

It is impossible not to notice the constant construction delays we encounter on Westheimer, yet the segment of pavement at the Mid Lane intersection continues to deteriorate. It seems help (or more immediate inconvenience) is on the way thanks to METRO's **Boost 82** program intended to improve service for the No. 82 Westheimer bus.

As we understand it, METRO's original plan was to resurface only the outside "bus" lanes of Westheimer, which would have created an abrupt difference in the grade levels of the street. The plan wisely evolved to include all lanes of Westheimer resulting in this proposed schedule of repairs:

Railroad to Weslayan – April through July, 2024 Railroad to 610 – July through September, 2024 Weslayan to Buffalo Speedway – September through December, 2024

The Boost 82 plan involves more than street repairs, including **upgraded driveways**, new and/or improved **sidewalks** with **improved ramps** and **safer crossings**, **well-lit bus shelters** with **trash receptacles**, and **digital**, **real-time bus arrival schedules**.

# Garbage Fees May Be in Our Future

Apparently, to dig itself out of the financial hole that Mayor Whitmire inherited, the City is once again considering imposing a fee for garbage collection, estimated to run between \$25 to \$30 per household per month based on the costs outlined in the City's plan proposed back in 2021. (\$20 - \$25 garbage fee plus a monthly "Clean City" fee of \$5.61) An in-depth analysis by former mayoral candidate, Bill King, indicates that most neighborhoods that hire private garbage collection get better, more reliable service and the average cost is considerably less than the fees that we may soon be charged. Perhaps we should consider private garbage collection, too.

All our costs are going up. In addition to potential garbage fees, water rates continue to rise and it is being reported that the City will seek to increase property tax rates to pay for firefighters.

Weekly household trash pick up on Mondays. NOTE: Recycling is every other Monday, on highlighted days in boxes. Please have your bins out on the curb those days by 7 am and in by 10 pm.

"Tree Waste" is defined as "clean wood waste such as tree limbs, branches, and stumps (lumber, furniture, and treated wood will NOT be accepted.)"

"Junk Waste" is defined as "items such as furniture, appliances, and other bulky material."
